NATS National Board Meetings held in Florida

The NATS National Board Meetings were held at Atlantic Beach, Florida over several days at the end of June. Both Past Governor Lewis and Governor LaRoche attended the meetings held over three days. Additional MAR members in attendance included Dr. Randy Umstead, Secretary/Treasurer and DeMar Austin Neal IV, Vice President for Workshops. Reports were presented by each national officer and region governor as well as reports from each committee.

Highlights included discussion of the new International Region and the first conference of the South Africa Chapter held in Stellenbosch, South Africa in July. International Region Governor Sarah Holman is helping with this event along with the officers of the newly formed chapter. Bronwen Forbay has been instrumental in this chapter creation and is presenting at the conference. She is from South Africa and currently resides in the Mid-Atlantic Region in South Carolina.

This will be the first year that Commercial Music and Children and Youth Categories advance to the National auditions. The board discussed ways to increase involvement and to also accommodate new students and families at the chapter, region, and national auditions. The finals will take place at the NATS National Conference scheduled for June 28-July 2, 2024 in Knoxville, Tennessee.
